Perkins Shipping runs a barge from Darwin to Elcho Island Ph: (08) 8982 2035. Leave Darwin on a Thursday night, arrive Tues pm or Wed am. Weekly barge delivery. Perishables can be transported. Average weekly shop of about 8 boxes costs around \$40. Bulk bush orders from Woolworths Casuarina Darwin available Ph: (08) 8945 9222.

Air North to Darwin, 2 flights daily on Mon Wed Fri and Sunday, 1 flight daily on Tues, Thurs and Sat. These timetables sometimes change during the wet season with a decrease in flights available. Airmed access – evacuations to Nhulunbuy or Darwin depending on severity of condition. Strip is sealed day/night strip. In bad weather during the wet season Air Med may not be able to land at night.

- Primary K-7, classes given in English but with an ESL model, if numbers great enough school may cater for English only class. Otherwise parents can look at School of the Air either supplementation or full time - requires parental tuition
- Secondary and for what years of secondary school NT open Learning Centre via correspondence, requires supervision at home
- If the school is bilingual, can non-indigenous students attend? No information available

RECREATION/SPORTING:

RELIGION

Church services available in the community:

Uniting church service- Sundays

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MEDICAL:

- Health Service operated by: Ngalkanbuy Health Service – independent health service
- GP employed by: Ngalkanbuy Health Service – independent health service
- Hours of operation/on-call: 7.6 hr day, 8.30 – 4.30 pm with an hour off for lunch, health worker always 1st on call with 1:4 rotation between Dr and RNs for 2nd on call back up

Staffing at the clinic:

- number of GP's: 1
- number of RN's: 3
- number of Health Workers: Varies but usually 6 at any given time

Visiting health professionals:

- type of service (e.g. dental): Physician, gynecologist, surgeon, dentist, paediatrician, psychiatrist. All come roughly 3 monthly. For eye, orthopedic etc
- frequency and duration of visits: referral appointments can be made for Nhulunbuy visits
