HISTORY OF THE COMMUNITY

Santa Teresa was established as a Catholic Mission in the 1950s to house Aboriginal people who mostly came from the Alice Springs region.

80 km SE of A/Springs, 15 km sealed 65-km of wide unsealed road. The road is passable for conventional vehicles at most times. The road is often quite rough with corrugations and sand and “bulldust” patches are not uncommon.
Road will close with heavy rain and 4WD is recommended. Trip takes anything from 45 mins –2hrs depending on road conditions.

SCHOOL:

What schooling options are available locally?

There is one school that caters for the Aboriginal children in the community. The school offers a bilingual model of education with lessons in Arrernte and English and as such would not be suitable for mainstream children. School run for K-yr 10. There are 13 teachers, including 2 indigenous trained teachers, several tutors, a large Literature Production Centre and a Community Library.

Children attending school from pre school follow the NT curriculum. Post primary children are following courses in Foundation studies, which is a bridging course for those who wish to enter mainstream education. Some students are following correspondence courses from N.T.O.E.C organisation.

No non indigenous pupils attend full time at this stage, School of the Air with parental supervision is required although children doing this often come to the school for afternoon sessions of sport etc. NT Open Learning via correspondence

There is an Adult Education Centre which offers enrichment courses for the Community in areas such as art, craft, leather making, and pottery and also in drink driving.
